FORMER HAITI FOREIGN MINISTER DULY BRUTUS HEADLINES CNP BENEFIT

The Honorable Duly Brutus was born in a small community in northern Haiti. He grew up to serve his country in many capacities. He has been the Speaker of the House in Haiti's Parliament, Ambassador to the Organization of American States and most recently the Foreign Minister.



We were fortunate to have Ambassador Brutus speak to our annual benefit that helped raise crucial dollars for our programs assisting the children of Haiti. Ambassador Brutus' uplifting speech was a history of Haiti, its tumultuous past and its bright future.

We also presented the first annual Deborah Watlington Heart for Haiti Service Award. Deb, who passed away late last year, poured her heart into helping the people of Haiti and CNP. It was most fitting that the award be named in her honor. It was presented to her husband, Dr. Rob Watlington, by legendary University of Tennessee football coach Phillip Fulmer.

EXPANDING WATER AND SANITATION EQUALS HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

In Haiti, less than 50% of households have access to safe water and only 25% have adequate sanitation services.



Since 1998, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) has been a central mission of Kore Timoun/CNP. Working with Rotary Clubs in the Chattanooga, Tennessee, area and the residents of the remote community of Baret, we have just finished an ambitious project there in the mountains of Haiti.

Recently, employing local Haitian builders, we completed 100 latrines for the community in Baret. 97 of those latrines were for households, two for the local schools, and one for the community church.



Because of the success of this project, we are now moving on to another mountain community that needs assistance. Our CNP team and Rotary Club members are now working in the community of Beloc. Our goal there is the

same work with the local community to improve sanitation and build a healthier community for its families.



MESSAGE FROM CHRIS DEVANEY, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AT CNP/KORE TIMOUN



Recently, I returned from our headquarters in Leogane, Haiti. Every time I get back from spending time with our dedicated staff, I know how much God has blessed this organization with the people and the skills necessary to help the children and families in Haiti.

The Children's Nutrition Program of Haiti, or Kore Timoun as it is known there, has been working to fight the blight of childhood malnutrition for almost two decades. Since our inception in 1998, Kore Timoun has decreased childhood malnutrition where we work from 25% to less than 3%. We have focused on the mountains where the greatest problem existed, but now the malnutrition problem is in the plains near the coastal areas of Leogane, which has seen an outburst


of growth since the 2010 earthquake. The graph below tells you the story of the hard work that has been done over the past year.

The photo on this page shows one of our courageous staff members whose title is Monitrice (community health care workers). These brave women work in their communities to teach young mothers about proper nutrition and breast-feeding. They also help rescue malnourished children and put them in our rehabilitation program. To expand our operations, means hiring more Monitricers.
